Demonstration by Viv Harvey



We were treated to a wonderfully creative demonstration evening by Viv Harvey who visited us West **Northants** from Woodturners based Weedon – a fun evening resulting in some really beautiful creative and pieces. Viv showed us how to produce a number of different pieces usina

inexpensive construction red wood which he turned, burned and coloured. Inexpensive materials resulting in very sellable items thus producing a healthy margin. Plus some onions!



Viv started with 2 3/4" x 2 3/4" redwood and turned between centres until round also creating spigot for mounting in the chuck. No sanding or sealing required as the piece are burned to finish. mounted Once in chuck measure and mark 1/3 to 2/3 leaving some for parting off.



Mark the base and candle cup heights and then form the desired shape, you can add rings etc. Don't make the piece too thin around the neck as it will be burned. Drill hole for candle with Forstner bit.

Remove the piece from the chuck, leave the shoulder on as it acts as a handle for burning, painting and varnishing.





Two bowls can be produced together in the same fashion as shown here.

These are now ready for burning with a blow torch – best to do outside and away from wood shavings, thinners and denatured alcohol.

Burn heavily to create texture and contrast – this is where you don't want to have gone too thin around the hole for the candle.

For a small pot, turn the inside after burning/painting so it ends clean.





Wire brushes of varying textures should be used. Use a good pressure and look to brush off the

areas between the rays in the grain to bring out the contrast.



Other combos can be produced eg stubby pot/candle stick plus vase. When parting the pot, turn off below the spigot so it can be remounted. Drill the centre of the vase to fit a plastic test tube to contain water.







Inexpensive paints are available from B+M, Hobby Craft, The Works, The Range and Sostrene Grene...plus others. Best to use Acrylic or Poster Paints. Hobbycraft sell Shimmer paints as well.

Finish with varnish to seal. Paul recommends Alloy Wheel varnish from ebay – dries very quickly apparently.

Paint with a single colour or bleed 2, 3 or 4 together. No need to wet wood first.

Try 'dry brushing' where you spread the paint

out thinly and then brush off leaving a thin variable layer which can then take a 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} layer etc in different colours.

You can also thin these paints with water & brushes also clean in water. When using more than one colour, a design tip is to use the same colour on the opposite side ie 180° around, and vary the colours.

Paint under the rim of a bowl so, when dry, you can turn out the centre.



The finishing stages shown on a three-bowl combo below in order from Burn, through Brush to Colour. The contrast of the burning and colour bleeding illustrated really well in the bowls and vases. Great work Viv!







Viv's finale involved creating a great bunch of Onions. Strange but true. He used a small branch of Yew which provides a great colour for the finished onion as does Walnut.



The approach is similar to making an apple. Leave a little natural edge bark, apply sanding sealer, sand through the grits and then wax.

A hole needs to be drilled through the onion to take the raffia stalks.

Push a loop of string through the hole, put raffia through the loop and pull it back through the onion. Cut the raffia, rough it up and glue with CA.







Thanks for a great evening Viv and bringing us an insight in to your creative work. I'm sure members will be trying out your techniques and experimenting with colour...and onions.
